School Systems Updates:

Morning time arrangements: well done to all the boys and girls who arrive onsite before 8.50am. The pre-school yard lining up system (in pods) is working well. Yard is supervised from 8.40am. Pupils should not be onsite before this time.

Refinements to morning time arrangements: to avoid parents congregating at or near pupil doors we ask the following:

- If bringing your child to yard and their class is still lined-up in pods: your child joins their class pod in the line-up and parents can wait in the waiting zones.
- If your child's class has begun moving to their entry door or the class is already gone in, child alone can walk up to their entry door. Parents are asked not to approach the pupil entry doors.
- Finally, whilst 90% of pupils are now coming in before 9am, a full 10% of pupils daily are arriving after 9am. These pupils (averaging well over 40 pupils daily) are arriving late to school. This is obviously not acceptable. To avoid congestion at the front door, from Monday 14th December late pupils must come to the infant corridor door, their names will be taken and if late 3 times in quick succession, parents will receive an Aladdin message / phone call from the school.

Staggered home-times for last day of term: Tuesday 22nd December is our last day of term. To avoid overcrowding, the staggered home-times are as follows:

Infant classes: 11.30am home-time
1st & 2nd classes: 11.40am home-time
3rd & 4th classes: 11.50am home-time

• 5th & 6th classes: 12pm midday home-time

The morning start times will remain unchanged on 22nd December. School reopens for all on Wednesday 6th January 2021.
